Mayor Neil Perry Encourages Residents to Take Advantage of Free Coronavirus Testing to “Stop the Spread”



In September, the City of Methuen was named as a Testing Center for Governor Baker's STOP THE SPREAD program against the COVID-19 virus. Testing under the STOP THE SPREAD campaign is open to everyone, and the selection of Methuen is a plus for our city. The STOP THE SPREAD program is a great opportunity for our residents to get free testing, whether they are symptomatic or asymptomatic. While test results will be provided to each participant confidentially, the overall test data will help to inform the state and our local community as to next steps in fighting COVID-19.

STOP THE SPREAD is a Commonwealth of Massachusetts strategic testing program that supports the testing of asymptomatic individuals in these communities to help stop the spread of COVID-19. The Methuen Cares Center has moved to its new location at the Central Administration Building, 10 Ditson Place with hours of 9am - 1pm, Monday through Friday. We are excited to announce that the Veterans food program run by Randy Carter will continue to partner with Methuen Cares.

The Center continues to accept donations of paper goods, shelf-stable foods & drinks, school supplies, masks/gloves (PPE), hand sanitizer, household bleach, cleaning solutions with at least 70% alcohol, & common antiviral household disinfectants. 
Veterans Needs Assessment Survey Aids Methuen's Heroes



Methuen has over 5,000 Veterans with approximately 55 Veterans or eligible family members receiving Veterans benefits directly from the city to assist them with living and medical expenses – magnified by the COVID-19 pandemic. Currently, we are planning a Veterans Day Observance with the Methuen American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars posts, and the annual Flag retirement scheduled for Monday, December 7, 2020. Massachusetts COVID-19 Travel Order in Effect



Effective August 1, 2020, all visitors and returning residents entering Massachusetts must follow new travel orders. The Commonwealth has made great progress to slow the spread of COVID-19 and gradually re-open the economy, and all visitors have a responsibility to help us keep transmission levels as low as possible. All visitors entering Massachusetts, including returning residents, who do not meet an exemption, are required to:

- Complete the Massachusetts Travel Form prior to arrival, unless you are visiting from a lower-risk state designated by the Department of Public Health.
- Quarantine for 14 days or produce a negative COVID-19 test result that has been administered up to 72-hours prior to your arrival in Massachusetts.

If your COVID-19 test result has not been received prior to arrival, visitors and residents must quarantine until they receive a negative test result. Failure to comply may result in a \$500 fine per day. Please find more information, including the list of lower-risk states, exemptions, business guidance and other details, at mass.gov.

COVID-19 Increases Need to Sign Up for Smart911 Alerts



Smart911 allows residents to sign up online and provide vital information to 911 call takers during an emergency, allowing first responders to make faster and more informed responses. Residents and visitors can create a safety profile for their whole household that includes any information they might want 911 dispatchers and first responders to have in the event of an emergency, such as allergy information or pre-existing medical conditions.

With the COVID-19 pandemic ongoing, there is even more of a need for first responders to be aware of any pre-existing conditions on emergency calls. Smart911 is private and secure, is only used for emergency responses, and is only made available to the 911 system in the event of an emergency call. 

Contact Tracing a Crucial Part of COVID-19 Safety

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts created the COVID-19 Community Tracing program to help support local health departments from every community. The program focuses on reaching out to people who have tested positive for COVID-19 and the contacts they have been close to, providing support to isolate or quarantine. When the MA COVID Team calls, you can do your part by answering the phone and providing helpful information. Calls from the MA COVID Team will use the prefix 833 & 857 with Caller ID as "MA COVID Team." Calls are made from 8am-8pm.



Methuen Implements See-Click-Fix for Resident Requests

City Will Initially Use Interactive Tool for COVID-19 Related Issues

In an effort to improve resident access to assistance across a wide range of topics and issues, Mayor Neil Perry has instituted SeeClickFix, an interactive system that will allow the City of Methuen to be more responsive and transparent.



SeeClickFix creates an effective two-way exchange of information between the city and its residents. It also helps to speed up response time and problem solving. Mayor Perry notes, "This tool empowers residents to do something more than observe and experience frustration with city-related issues. Residents can now take action and report issues creating prompt and positive solutions."

Once the SeeClickFix app is installed on your phone, it takes just a minute or two to notify the city of a concern. This is a positive neighborhood tool that allows our residents to communicate with their government and have their concerns addressed promptly. Initially, the city will be using SeeClickFix for COVID-19 related issues only. Visit cityofmethuen.net and click on the "Report a COVID-19 Issue" link to let us know of any COVID related problems or issues encountered.

"SeeClickFix is accessible to residents either via the SeeClickFix app or the city website," said Mayor Perry. "With our departments busier than ever dealing with everyday tasks plus COVID-19 challenges, this is a valuable tool for residents to reach city hall more efficiently and directly. I want to thank our department heads and their teams for helping to get this initiative started." SeeClickFix will be rolled out for all city departments over the next 6 months. The city will keep residents updated on new developments as it continues to focus on understanding and addressing the needs of all residents; SeeClickFix is one tool to assist us in accomplishing that goal.

City of Methuen COVID-19 Small Business Grant Program

The City of Methuen is making available grant funds of up to \$10,000 to qualifying small businesses within the City of Methuen adversely impacted by COVID-19. These funds are to be used to cover commercial mortgages, rents, and utilities.

Are you a Methuen business who has five (5) or fewer employees, one or more of whom owns the business, is owned by low or moderate income person(s) (<80% of the Area Median Income, based on family/household size and city/town where you live not where your business is located), is a for-profit entity (sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, or LLC), has a physical establishment in Methuen in good standing, has been in business for at least one full tax year before 01/01/2019, is currently in operation (including working remotely or have temporarily suspended operations pursuant to the Governor's Emergency Order), and can document a loss of income of \$5,000 or more due to COVID-19? Help may be available for you.

Clerk's Office Makes Voting Accessible Amid COVID-19 Restrictions



Despite the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, voters have several options for exercising their right to vote in the 2020 State Election, including voting early by mail, voting early in person from October 17-30, and voting at their precinct location on Election Day, November 3, 2020 with polls open from 7am-8pm. Early Voting is available now through October 30 at The Loop, 90 Pleasant Valley Street, Suite 320, (Next door to Marshalls and Olympia Sports). There will be NO Early Voting in Sanborn Hall, Public Safety Building, 90 Hampshire St., due to the expected high voter turnout and the need to maintain safe social distancing. Please note that Park Gardens Apartments is no longer be available as a polling location for Precincts 4 & 5 due to public health concerns brought on by COVID-19. The Methuen Senior Center, 77 Lowell Street, is the new polling location for the residents of precincts 4 and 5.

No appointment is necessary to deliver Vote-By-Mail/Absentee ballots to City Hall, 41 Pleasant Street. COVID-19 Cannot Stop Our Senior Center’s Service



Nevins Library Now Open with COVID- 19 Safety in Mind




Have you heard? Nevins Memorial Library at 305 Broadway is now open 4 days a week. On Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9am-6pm, on Wednesdays from 9am-8pm, and on Saturdays from 9am-3pm. 
